Affirming support for comprehensive immigration reform.

2. Council Bill [116791](#) PASSED (7 – 0)

Relating to the creation of the Seattle Youth Commission to advise and make recommendations to the Mayor and City Council on policies of importance to the City, repealing Chapters 3.66 and 3.68 of the Seattle Municipal Code and adding a new Chapter 3.67 to the Seattle Municipal Code.
